eMATES - Empowering migrant-backgrounded marginalised adults in e-government access through foreign language education by language educators training

The eMates Erasmus+ project aims to bridge the digital divide among adult migrants by strengthening the skills of second-language (L2) educators in teaching e-government through innovative methods and supporting materials for A1, A2, and B1 language levels. We help L2 educators expand their reach by codeveloping strategies that address the specific challenges migrants face during integration—using language learning and e-government as tools for greater independence.

Planned activities include:

- Developing a complementary curriculum for L2 educators that covers key areas of egovernment, includes language frameworks for A1, A2, and B1 levels, and establishes a practical methodology;
- creating accessible materials and hands-on guidance for and with L2 educators to teach egovernment to adult migrants;

 and organising local L2 learning activities supported by an online platform, focused on egovernment and solving real-life situations.

Expected project outcomes:

- A curriculum to help L2 educators adapt each language session for digital learning with adult migrants.
- Practical resources to help L2 teachers refresh their lessons with real-world e-government scenarios and encourage a more active role for learners.
- An online platform to foster innovative use of digital content for adult migrants and help language teachers strengthen their digital skills.

The kick-off meeting took place in Reus from January 28th to 29th, 2025. Project partners visited DomSpain, the hosting institution. Key principles of collaboration were agreed upon, with the coordinator presenting an overview of the project and partners confirming their roles and responsibilities.

Strategic alignment among all partners was reinforced, ensuring a shared understanding of objectives and a unified approach.

Clear next steps were defined, including timelines for deliverables, task assignments, and coordination of upcoming activities.

Partners worked on: project administration and finances, WP2: Training Materials for L2 Adult Educators, quality and risk management, implementation plan, green monitoring, project visuals and branding, and the communication and monitoring plan.
